Ken White, a Cree Elder from the Louis Bull Tribe, is a proud member of one of the four nations situated in Maskwacis, Alberta, under Treaty 6. He shares 48 years of marriage with Lorraine White and is blessed with 3 children and 13 grandchildren.

Certified as an Environmental Monitor, Ken possesses a deep knowledge of Cree culture, language, and traditions. He serves as a pipe carrier and lodge keeper, carrying forward important spiritual practices. Over the past 48 years, Ken has dedicated himself to community service, particularly focusing on the

well-being of children, youth, and families. He draws upon traditional practices and wisdom passed down through generations in his bloodline.

Ken is passionate about people and healing the elements of Mother Earth—air, water, land, and resources—including addressing issues like climate change through ceremonies and prayer. Ken advocates for a collaborative approach, where all disciplines and sciences work together to protect Mother Earth.

Elder Ken White is a descendant of Joe White, a well-known and respected healer, interpreter and leader. Joe White was the last known Pony Express Rider who rode between Canada and the United States.
